

2019 EMERGENCY OPERATIONS PLAN (EOP)



PURPOSE OF THE EOP

THE EMERGENCY OPERATIONS PLAN:

1. Provides a consistent, familiar framework for the Town of Castle Rock's response to disasters and other incidents which overwhelm normal operational resources.
2. Provides a consistent response and recovery plan for all levels of government.
 - National Incident Management System (NIMS)
 - National Response Framework (NRF)
3. Sets departmental expectations and responsibilities across Town departments during disaster response.

CHANGES SINCE 2005

CONSISTENT WITH DOUGLAS COUNTY EOP

Aligns the Town of Castle Rock's EOP with that of Douglas County Office of Emergency Management to provide as smooth of transition as possible during escalating incidents.

CONSISTENCY WITH FEMA

Identifies departmental functions and responsibilities consistent with FEMA's Emergency Support Function (ESF)

FRAMEWORK FOR THE EOC

Sets the organization framework for the Town's Emergency Operations Center, also consistent with Douglas County Office of Emergency Management's EOC

INCIDENT ESCALATION GUIDE

Includes a guideline for Town staff on when an incident may require escalation, and EOC activation

SAMPLE VERBIAGE

Provides sample verbiage for Local Disaster Declaration, State of Emergency and Delegation of Authority

TOWN COMMITMENT

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT FOR DISASTER-EMERGENCY MUTUAL AID AND DISASTER EMERGENCY RESOURCES ASSISTANCE (RESOLUTION 2018-045)

As a participant in the IGA for Disaster-Emergency Mutual Aid the Town of Castle Rock has committed to ensuring that 0.02% of the Town's assessed value is available for Disaster-Emergency spending.

2018 Assessed Value	Disaster-Emergency Spending Threshold
\$967,415,150	\$193,483

There is no budget impact: the Town reserves exceed the agreement criterion
