

Assistant Town Clerk, Robbie Schonher attended the Colorado Municipal Clerks Institute this year for the first of her three-year commitment toward obtaining her Certified Municpal Clerk designation.

The Colorado Institute for Municipal Clerks has been developed in conjunction with the International Institute of Municipal Clerks (IIMC), the Colorado Municipal Clerks Association (CMCA), and Regis University Conference Services. The Institute offers 120 hours of course work in public administration, managerial skills, interpersonal skills, and technically related subjects over the course of three annual one-week sessions. Faculty has been chosen from academic, public, and private organizations on the basis of their experience and ability to contribute to the dynamic, in-depth learning experience. Participant involvement is continually encouraged to enhance the learning process. Completion of the Institute program can be applied toward the IIMC Certified Municipal Clerks designation. "The vision of the Colorado Institute is to be the primary educational opportunity for municipal clerks by providing a balanced, broad-based curriculum to develop confidence and competence in technical, interpersonal, political, and personal leadership skills."


