

Did You Know?

1915 Colorado Outlawed Alcohol 1919 National Prohibition September 26, 1933 - 21st Amendment to Repeal **National Prohibition**

Colorado is a License State - allows private enterprises to buy and sell alcohol.

There are 17 Control States (State monopoly) the government takes over the wholesale trade and conducts the retail sale of heavier alcoholic beverages through its own stores selling to individuals, bars and restaurants or to other liquor stores.

Most have an "Alcoholic Beverage Control" (ABC) board and run liquor stores called ABC/state stores. A parallel license system is used to regulate lighter alcoholic beverages (beer and wine).
