Mayor Gray, Castle Rock Council Members -

First, thank you so much for all you have done and are doing. Not just in the face of COVID-19, but much prior to that, as well. My family absolutely loves living here and has been so impressed with its civil servants. You're the best!

Second, I'm on your side. I want to fall in line with the procedures and codes of the City. To that end, I come to you to seek your assistance in raising awareness and implementing additional measures with regard to a public health issue.

On a regular morning walk about two weeks ago, an off-leash dog attacked my on-leash dog, ripping open her neck. After a half-day spent at the emergency vet, three sets of stitches, and bottles of meds, her recovery cost nearly \$800.

I am aware this is not a new issue. In fact, one request I have of you is to commend the CR.gov Parks & Rec department (especially Tara McGraw) and the Animal Control division of the Police (especially Officer Hutchings). Their response was swift, compassionate, and understanding—they see it all too often, but do not have sufficient resources to address it properly.

I am humbly urging the Council to allocate additional resources. One area particularly prone to Animal Ordinance violations is the Native Legend Open Space trail. The proximity to hundreds of homes, combined with the vistas and rolling ridges, has led to dozens of off-leash dogs per day. I see them all day, every day from my back deck.

I also see a toddler girl learning to skate, hand-in-hand with her daddy. The new moms walking their strollers, a cherished infant nestled inside. The young boy strengthening his legs and lungs, cycling over the pavement with his parent. And bluebirds! There are a dozen bluebird boxes on the Native Legend trail alone! Off-leash dogs injure all of these things—little girls get knocked over, strollers are sniffed without permission, young boys collide with dogs, the Colorado Bluebird Project is hampered. And dog-on-dog attacks create financial and relational damage.

Further, the most common excuse I hear is, "My dog is on an electronic leash." The fact that this is a violation of the ordinance needs city-wide emphasis.

Please consider what of the following is feasible in the immediate future:

- 1) Increasing the fine for off-leash dogs to \$250. (This is barely 1/3 the cost of a vet visit, and people rarely change behavior without significant tangible consequences.)
- 2) Installing signs along the Native Legend trail akin to the postings at other open spaces (please see handout).
- 3) Initiating a Good Samaritan "Ranger" (paid or volunteer) system that monitors the trails and is authorized to issue citations. (This could be financed by increasing the dog license fee.)
- 4) Publishing a one- to two-page article in the Town of Castle Rock Outlook magazine with the benefits of keeping dogs on leash (please see handout).
- 5) Rewarding owners whose dog is ON-leash on the trails. Maybe with a biscuit for the dog?

In closing, I have been a Castle Rock volunteer for barely two weeks...but I enjoy it more than my twenty year career! I come to you as a resident-advocate who wants the safest experience for us all.
