Accounting

The Accounting Team provides financial services to internal and external customers such as payroll, accounts payable and receivable, investments and capital asset reporting. In addition, the team ensures financial transactions are recorded in accordance with the Town's Municipal Code and Governmental Accounting Standards and in compliance with governing laws and regulations.

Budget

The Budget Team supports departments Townwide with financial planning to attain strategic priorities in the short and long term. In addition to future budgeting and financial planning, the team actively monitors, analyzes and reports on Town financial activity throughout the year.

Revenue

The Revenue Team provides education and outstanding customer service to our community while licensing businesses and collecting sales tax with a "home town" feel and understanding. In addition, the team is involved in economic development, the Downtown Development Authority and the Urban Renewal Authority to align with the Town's vision.

Council Community Grant Program (CCGP) funds awarded

On March 3, Town Council awarded funds to four local applicants for the **2020 First Quarter Council Community Grant Program (CCGP)!** Per Town code, the Finance Department coordinates the application process for this program funded by the Non-profit Grants account in the General Fund and makes recommendations to Town Council who selects recipients of the grant funds. This program aims to support projects that contribute to Castle Rock's quality of life with emphasis on programs and activities for youth, seniors, community based environment and sustainability, and community based performing and visual arts. In 2020, up to \$8,000 is available in quarterly disbursements up to \$2,000. Learn more about the Council Community Grant Program.

2021 Budget development process continues

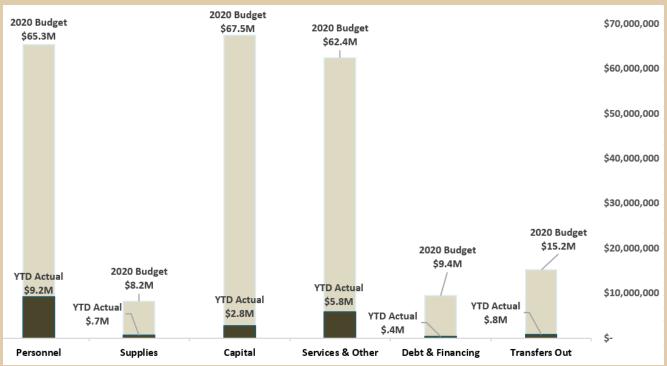

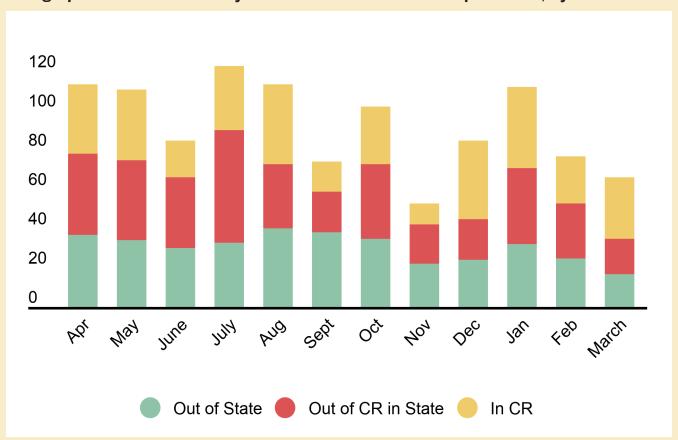

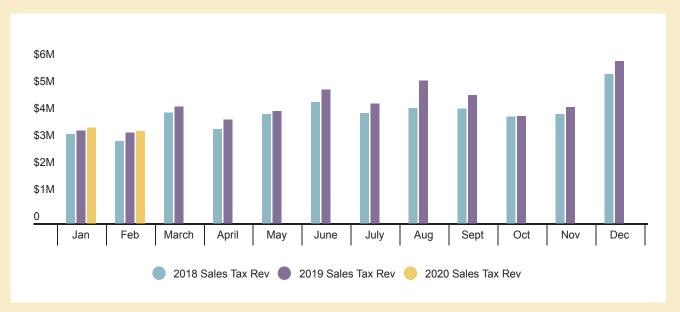

Spotlight on...

Finance working remotely

All Finance divisions have risen to meet the challenges of transition to remote work in order to keep the department operational. Each division manager reports:

Accounting

"We are working remotely to process weekly Accounts Payable checks. We are mailing all checks to payees' addresses including employee reimbursement checks. Please be sure to send all check requests electronically as staff is working remotely. We have worked with Mark Maloney, DolT Project Manager, and all departments to develop a check request form and process to be sent through DocuSign, a digital document packaging and signing platform, which will make the routing more efficient. We are working on a DocuSign process for Purchase Orders as well."

Budget

"In-person business has been traded for video conferencing, screen sharing, instant messaging, and email. While communicating with each other and each Town department using these methods is different, the Budget Team is getting used to a new normal and finding ways to be effective and efficient such as sharing documents on a conference call for all to see and make comments. Our analysts have done a great job staying connected to our departments and working with them to prepare the first 2020 budget amendment, our 2019 yearend report, and to identify where we have the flexibility to defer or reduce 2020 expenditures in the wake of continued economic uncertainty that changes by the day and even by the hour. We have even found ways to stay connected personally and bring joy to our work days by sharing encouraging messages and pictures of our dogs on instant messaging."

Revenue

"Revenue has been doing an outstanding job working remotely! We too have been using video conferencing, instant messaging and email. Everyone has been set up to work from home for the last few weeks. The front desk crew is handling deposits, phone calls and delinquencies. Additionally, they have set up a new process to receive audit payments online to expedite the payment process! Be safe and keep moving forward!!"
