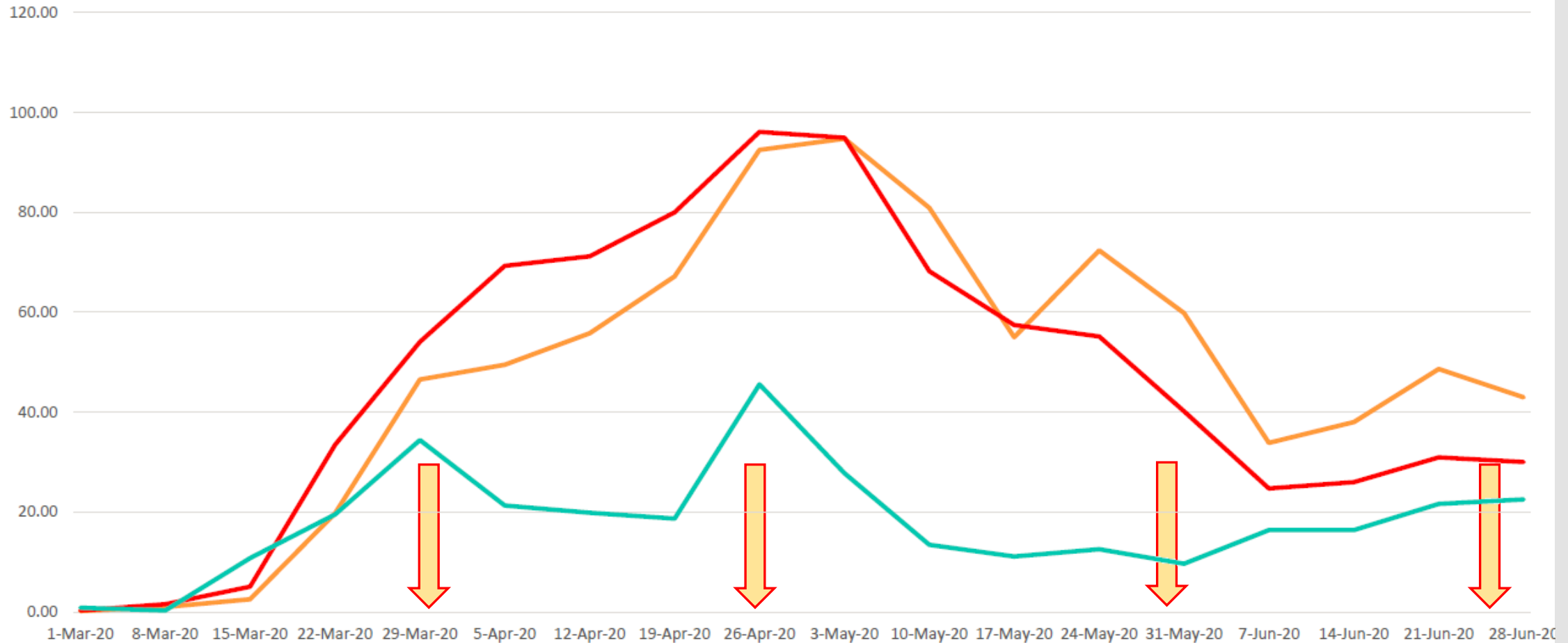

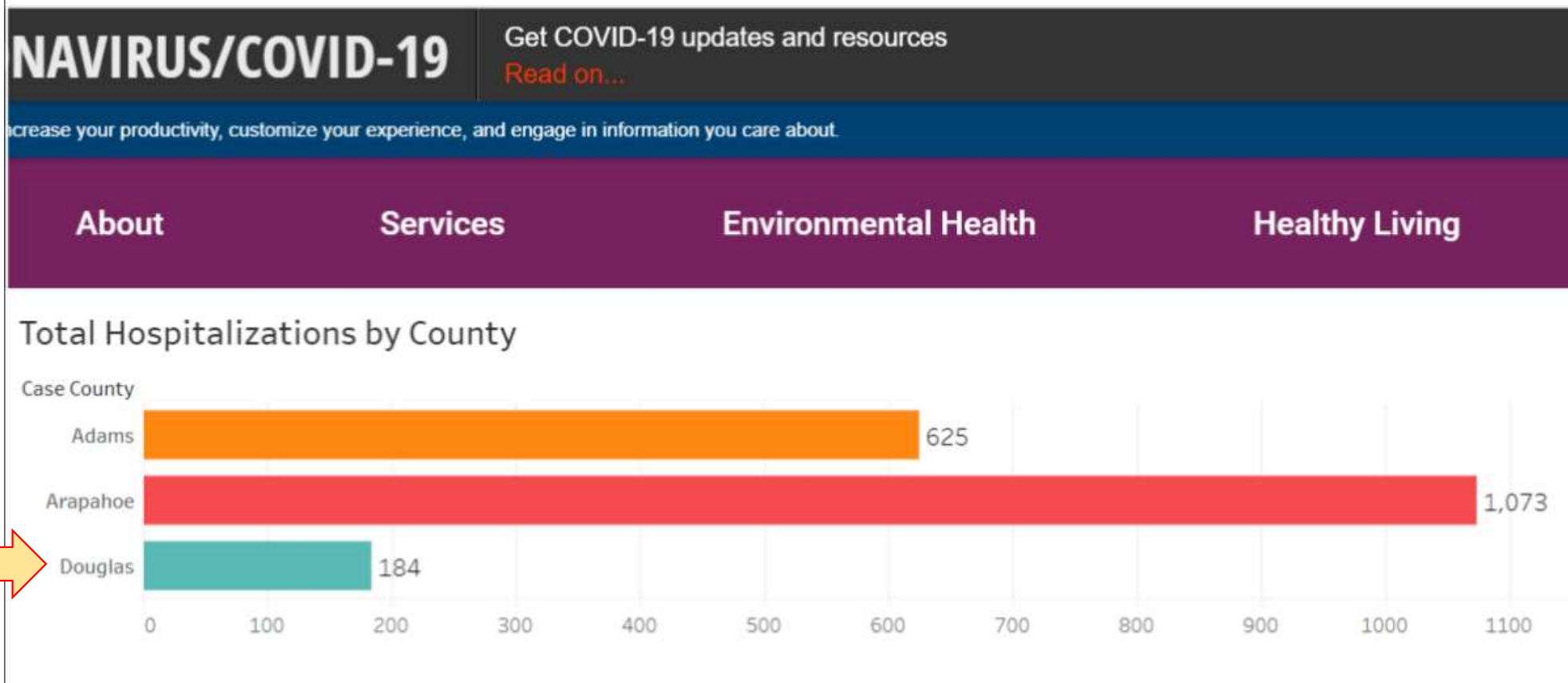
COVID-19 Weekly Incidence Rates per 100,000 by County
