Assistance to Businesses

Modifications: The Town's Clerk's Office has been working with local businesses and the State to quickly issue modifications to allow for additional outdoor dining spaces. These have been a combination of adding the DMA summer patios as we have done every summer, adding additional private parking lots, and some have applied for the COVID-19 Temporary modifications authorized by the State.

Public Consumption: The Town Clerk's Office requested allowing Public Consumption Areas in rights-of-way which was successfully approved by the Governor along with the State's Communal Dining Areas. The Town Manager is authorized to approve these areas and will accept requests from businesses.
