DIRECTION PROVIDED

- "Review additional businesses that may be qualified based on the classification of being a personal service as opposed to being a professional service."
- Include both first- and second-round grants
- Examine State executive orders in terms of what businesses were closed and which were allowed to open during the "Stay at Home" period
- Several, sometimes conflicting or unclear, sources of information exist, including:
 - State Yes (allowed to open) and No (must be closed) list
 - State "Stay at Home" order and order ceasing elective medical procedures
 - Secretary of State professional services information
 - State personal service information related to COVID reopenings

WHAT APPLICANTS WERE CLOSED?

- Information not collected for second-round grants, which focused on May-August
 - Of the nine businesses denied grants as professional services, it appears at least half were closed during the "Stay at Home" period
- First-round application asked businesses if they had experienced a pandemic-related closure
 - 22 of those denied as professional services said they had experienced a closure
 - Six of these noted they could still perform emergency services
 - 20 of those denied said they had not experienced a closure
- This closure information was not factored into the options outlined in the memo, but staff can provide an option considering this information as Council desires
- Staff does not have a recommendation on additional awards and would appreciate Council direction

ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATIONS

- Another component of Council's direction was to open up applications to businesses the State shut down and/or qualified as a personal service
 - Staff believed it prudent to wait until direction is given tonight as to who qualifies
 - If opening up for more applications, staff suggests this schedule:
 - Monday, Oct. 26 Grant applications open
 - Friday, Nov. 6 Grant applications close at 5 p.m.
 - Monday, Nov. 9 Review team meets to form recommendations
 - Thursday, Nov. 12 Recommendations published online by 5 p.m.
 - Tuesday, Nov. 17 Council reviews recommendations and makes awards
 - Late November Granted funds mailed to recipients
- Grants must be awarded by Dec. 30 to qualify for CARES Act reimbursement
