Description of specific project for requested funds:	Douglas Land Conservancy is interested in a \$500 grant to support our educational outreach program. The funds would offset the cost of presenters and educational speakers. All DLC programs are free to participants. DLC hosts hikes and speaker events throughout the year, Many in partnership with the Town of Castle Rock. For example, our Animals Around the Rock series of programs is in its 6th year. It is well attended by the

community with over 400 attendees some years (less in 2020). This year we have 5 programs planned. At all of the events, the Town of Castle Rock generously donates the use of the MAC Amphitheater, and DLC pays for the speakers. Additionally, DLC hosts many other outreach events that take place on DLC protected properties. Plans are in the works this year for 30 hikes, 6 speaker events, and a possible wellness program.

As our outreach programs grow we have also seen a huge increase in volunteer interest. We currently have more than 120 volunteers.
