Accounting



Grant funding available for local nonprofits; applications due Aug. 1

Nonprofit organizations that support Castle Rock residents and the community are invited to apply for grant money through the 2022 Philip S. Miller Resource Grant Program. Up to \$40,000 is available for up to five nonprofits. Organizations that provide projects or services geared toward the support of social and human services for Castle Rock residents may have eligibility. Specifically, the funding requests must include provisions for water, energy, food or shelter assistance. Applicants must demonstrate the ability to produce measurable results with municipal funds from previous projects.

More information and applications are available at CRgov.com/Grant. Completed applications are due by 5 p.m. on Sunday, Aug. 1.

The Finance Department will coordinate the application process for the Public Safety Commission. The commission will evaluate all applications and make funding recommendations to Town Council.
















Revenue



As sales tax returns are due 20 days after the end of the month, this report shows the prior month's revenue.

Communicating results

Sales tax collections for May were up 23.8 percent from the previous year's month, or up \$1,020,697 compared to May 2020. Year-to-date (YTD) collections are up 21.0 percent compared to the same time frame in 2020. As May wraps up, the outlook for sales tax remains optimistic. Staff is attributing the high numbers for May to the spending of stimulus and tax refund checks, with additional pent-up spending also playing a part. Staff will continue to monitor this very important revenue stream for the Town and inform as needed.
